

LOCAL TELEPHONE EXCHANGE SERVICE

Exchange: BRUCE CROSSING

A. GENERAL

1. The provision of service at the rates shown below is subject to the regulations given in the General Rules and Regulations as they now exist and are filed with and form part of this Tariff. (C)
2. The rates shown below (except for Semi-Public Service) entitle the customer to calls to all stations bearing the designation of a central office of the following exchanges, which comprise the Local Service Area: (C)
  - Zone 1 BRUCE CROSSING, EWEN (C)
  - Zone 2 All rate centers within the geographic boundaries of the 906 Area Code as of October 1, 2005 besides those included in Zone 1 (N)
3. The Company will Block 1-Plus Dialed Calls to Stations within the Local Service Area (except 8YY calls) (N)

\* No additional charge for the first 20 completed outgoing messages within Zone 1 of the local calling area per month. For messages in excess of 20 messages, there is an additional charge for each additional message at \$.10 each.

\*\*\* The company will not offer this class of basic local exchange service for new installations after June 30, 2001. If an end users action causes the disconnection of a line with this class of basic local exchange service for any reason (such as nonpayment of a bill for regulated service or movement to vacation rate), this class of service will not be available if the customer chooses to have service reinstalled.

Basic local exchange services installed after June 30, 2001 will include touchcall service at no additional charge above the rates listed for the class of service installed. Residence Flat Rate and Metered lines in service at July 1, 2001, that did not have touchcall service as an auxiliary service at the end of business June 30, 2001 will receive a monthly credit of \$1.50 during the period that line is in continual service after June 30, 2001 and touchcall service is not affirmatively added as an auxiliary service. Business One-Party lines and PBX trunks in service at July 1, 2001, that did not have touchcall service as an auxiliary service at the end of business June 30, 2001 will receive a monthly credit of \$2.00 during the period that line is in continual service after June 30, 2001 and touchcall service is not affirmatively added as an auxiliary service. If an end users action causes the disconnection of a line for any reason (such as nonpayment of a bill for regulated services, change of class of service or movement to vacation rate) that line will not qualify for any future touch call credit.
